One of the most pressing things I am facing as the administrator of Fair Haven right now is finding houseparents. I can't help but notice that almost all homes are dealing with houseparent shortages! In the past, we would maintain a list of prospective houseparents and homes would even network to help each other out.

There is not a shortage of children needing a safe place to live. We have all seen or heard of cases of children being abused or neglected and it breaks our hearts. However, there has to be a place for them to go and someone to care for them. God clearly states in the bible that we are to care for children but we need people who have the compassion for children and be willing to make a commitment to serve in this capacity.

I remember a song from many years ago written by Richard Klender and sung by a young girl called, "Dear Mr. Jesus." In it she is writing a letter to Jesus about being scared because she had seen a story on T.V. about child abuse. The entire song is her praying to Jesus about not understanding why this has happened. The chorus is "please don't let them hurt our children, we need love and shelter from the storm. Please don't let them hurt the children, won't You keep us safe and warm?" We have a shelter for the children, but we need houseparents in order to be able to help as many children as we can. HOUSE PARENTS NEEDED



For the last 59 years, Fair Haven has depended on two factors in this great work; our donors and our houseparents. Being a houseparent is often a challenging work, but it can be just as rewarding. Some of our parents stay for a few years, while others may be with us for 5-10 years or longer. One set of parents on campus have been here for over 15 years.

Currently, we have a couple of openings for houseparents and we would love to speak with you if you have an interest. Most of the training involved is done onsite and the job includes a competitive salary, health insurance (includes dental and vision), and approximately 1 week off every month. Fair Haven also provides a 6 bedroom/6 bath home, groceries, and utilities and houseparents are provided with a 12-passenger van for transporting the children. Housedads are often hired by Fair Haven, however, they have the option of being employed off-campus if they desire.

WORKING WITH KIDS By BRAD FOX

Over the past 33 years I have been privileged to work with many houseparents. I have been asked on numerous occasions "What does it take to really work well with kids in care?" If you want the short, simple, pat answer, it would be obvious: Love God and love kids. That's all, case closed! Oh, if it was that easy.

Most folks reading this right now love God and love kids. But most of us would not necessarily make really good childcare workers. We all have various strengths and weaknesses. Being aware of them, as well as being open and honest, is half of the battle. I believe there are certain characteristics that help anyone working with children in care be the most effective.

PATIENCE

Whether we are driving down the road or standing in line at the store, we are constantly reminded of the lack of patience in our culture. We want it, and we want it now! If it takes seven minutes and 32 seconds to get our meal at McDonalds our world turns upside down and we wonder "How can they call this FAST food??" As a general rule, the children we serve have often times received little patience in their lives. Most often there has been a lack of instruction and modeling, met with harsh consequences. As a result, patience can be a foreign concept, but is a solid building block for developing trust.

FAIRNESS

Kids are very quick to pick up on any type of perceived unfairness. This is a common denominator with the majority of children we have worked with over the years. When a child says that the world isn't fair, how can you argue with them? They are not blind. They see that most of the other kids at school live with their families. Any chance that we have to demonstrate fairness, goes a long way. The three long-standing principles of discipline are: Fair, Firm and Consistent, while attaching logical consequences (both positive and negative) as much as possible. We can't fix every wrong, but we can demonstrate that not everything in the world is unfair.

FLEXIBILITY

The effective childcare worker adapts a "win/win" mentality. Obviously there are times when absolutes must prevail, that is a given. We have to be willing to look beyond the situation at hand and act on what is best for the child in the long run. Maybe it is to hold firm or maybe it is to demonstrate that we can work together in compromise. It is not our job to win an

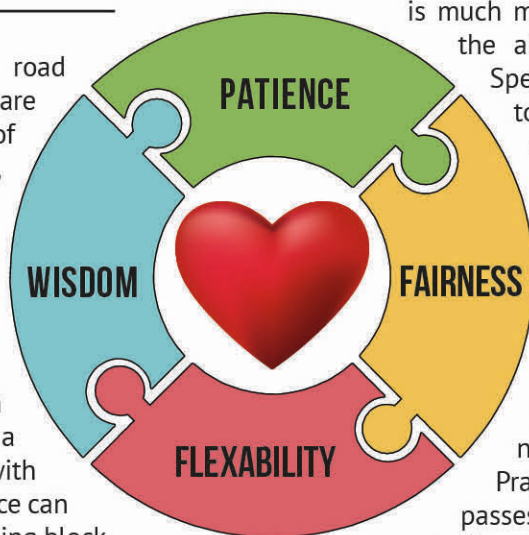
argument, but to help a child see that avoiding an argument may well be part of victory. A phrase that is often used is "avoiding power struggles." Have you even seen a picture of two bucks that have had their antlers locked together for so long they are both exhausted or dead? We've all seen it in relationships, even in religious circles, but there is no where it is more evident than working with kids whose lives have been shattered by the world around them.

WISDOM

I have had CPR training for decades. I have knowledge of what to do and have even practiced how to give CPR to a plastic head and torso. I have never put that in use in an emergency situation to try and save someone's life. Wisdom is much more than knowledge, it is defined as the ability to practically use knowledge.

Specifically in this setting, it is the ability to take our training and experiences and apply them with the above-mentioned principles to create a response that reaches out to help a child in need. This is easy to sit around and discuss, but a totally different thing to put into practice when it's way past bedtime, and you're dealing with it for the 75th time, and all the other duties and needs of the world are pulling on you.

Pray for our folks to have the peace that passes understanding and the wisdom to act like we would want God to treat us if we were in that child's shoes.



In Matthew chapter 10 Jesus sends out his apostles on what we refer to as the "limited commission" telling them to be as "shrewd as serpents and innocent as doves." The idea of balancing our behavior from a wide range of options, dependent upon our circumstances is not a new one. It was often demonstrated by Jesus himself, as well as the apostle Paul.

So back to the original question: "What does it take to really work well with kids in care?"

I am firmly convinced that the most effective childcare worker needs to be able to act like Mahatma Gandhi at times and Atilla the Hun at other times, while possessing the patience, fairness, flexibility and wisdom to know when to lean towards Gandhi or Atilla.

HELPING CHILDREN DEAL WITH LOSS

My last article in the Fair Haven Newsletter was centered around the therapeutic care of our residents. This article will focus on what the children in care lose when they are unable to live with their biological parents or in their home environment. One of the references I use in my training talks is "Too Many Losses Too Soon." We are talking about grief and loss in children who are in the foster care system. Grief and Loss are difficult for all of us to understand and deal with, but for younger children, it is even more complex. Children in foster care lose the opportunity to grow up with their biological family. As cognitive development begins to increase in younger children they start to question "why didn't my parents love me or why didn't my parents want me?" The children start to realize they have lost their home, their neighborhood, their friends, their personal items, and comforting and familiar surroundings are suddenly taken away. Their school, peers, church, relatives, pets, and personal items are no longer available to them. Loss is deeper than people and things. Being in foster care can involve other losses. Loss of culture, religion, birth history, medical information, sense of stability, safety and security, family traditions, siblings, and language can all occur.

Any one of these difficulties could be a challenge, but consider how a child or young person might react to these losses. There are different types of grief and loss. Ambiguous loss is the most devastating for the children because it usually lacks resolution, is confusing and unclear, and is unsettled. Normally, there is no fast or easy resolution or certainty.

These children show difficulty in being motivated, have low self-confidence, feel they do not belong, are uncertain of themselves, usually feel incompetent, believe the world is unfair, unmanageable, and do not feel guarded.

There are ways we can help children to deal with these uncertainties. We start by helping them understand the new friendships and relationships are not meant to replace the ones from their past. It's okay to speak about the past connections and speak of the role they played in the life of the child. Openly care and listen to a child's losses and allow the child to express their feelings. Understand that all feelings are acceptable and support all different emotions and thoughts of the child. Don't tell the children how to feel but accept how they feel and make sure they feel supported. Examine your own grief and loss history making sure to allow the child to tell their own story in their own way in their own time. Allow them to own their feelings. Be honest and realistic, but don't make promises that cannot be kept. Finally, seek help and support from a qualified trained professional.
